

**Woo Kukwon** 

Born in 1976, Seoul, South Korea Lives and works in Seoul, South Korea

At first glance, Woo Kukwon's canvas appears like a scene from a fairy tale. The most distinctive features of his work are the childlike imagery painted in vibrant colors and the thick matière. The artist employs any tool necessary to create the desired texture, whether it be a brush, pencil, or even his fingers. However, upon closer inspection, his work is not purely bright and cheerful.

While the initial impression exudes liveliness, this gradually fades as one examines the details and the surrounding environment of the characters in the artwork. His cynical phrases further immerse the audience in contemplation. He leaves interpretation entirely up to the viewer, and as his nickname, "the Korean Basquiat," suggests, his exhibitions have made him one of the most sought-after artists among collectors.

Woo Kukwon often features adorable children and animals in his paintings while deliberately omitting a clear point of view or explanation. His friendly, fairy tale-like images allow viewers of all ages to engage effortlessly with his works. As soon as they encounter his paintings, they are drawn into a game of questioning and seeking answers within the artwork itself.

His works include witty yet profound statements such as "I hate mornings." or "The more I know about people, the more I like my dog." These lines elicit a bittersweet but sincere smile, keeping viewers in front of his paintings for extended periods. The contrast between the bright and harmonious finished image and the chaotic, serious text invites repeated engagement with the work.

The imaginary world of Woo Kukwon is boundless and unrestricted. Unconventional colors feel familiar, and the sight of a girl and an animal sleeping together blends naturally within the canvas. As he once stated, "My work starts from frank emotions such as happiness, joy, jolliness, anger, hate, jealousy, envy, weakness, frustration, etc. Almost like a child who spends half a day happily just by wiggling his toes."

His works are part of major institutional collections, including the National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Korea; Kolon Group; Ilshin Cultural Foundation; and Maeil Dairies. In 2022, he held his first solo exhibition in France at 313 Art Project Paris.
